"It was particularly pleasing to see the work done by governors in supporting your ongoing review of procedures and improvements. With their support and external view point the school is sure to remain vigilant in driving forward with further aspects of safeguarding best practice.

"As you noted to me yourself, safeguarding is the responsibility of everyone engaged at the school - staff, governors, parents and children. With all those groups supporting, discussing and helping move the agenda forward you are sure to create the safest learning environment possible."
