

This is for children in all year groups, reception through to year 6 and your permission is required. In an attempt to reduce the burden put on schools in the administration of this campaign, this year the NHS decided to contact parents directly, via a postal consent campaign. We understand the response has been low, so we will be sending consent forms out to you via email in the next couple of weeks. There will be instructions as to what to do next, so please look out for the email and act straight away to have your child vaccinated. Thank you.

Payments to school



A school dinner costs £2.30 37 days @£2.30 = £85.10

Menus are on the school website. Children in Reception, year 1 and year 2 all receive universal free school meals. Lunches are payable for children in Preschool and years 3-6. We ask that you keep on top of lunch payments - in advance or on the day thank you. Please pay promptly for all school lunches, milk and after school clubs. For those of you new to Hipsburn Primary and by way of a reminder, we accept cash and cheques (payable to NCC – Northumberland County Council). Please put payment in a named envelope, with details of what you're paying for, and drop it in the class box or in the basket in the school's front porch. If paying by cheque, everything can go on the same cheque; if paying by cash, please try to give the exact money as we are trying to minimise items going back and forth between home and school.
