Reading

- Complete any activities sent to you over School360
- Practise your sounds and reading books daily
- Read a different type of text every day (fiction story, non-fiction book, poetry, recipe etc.)
- Ask and answer questions about what you have read

Writing

- Complete any activities sent to you over School360
- Write different types of texts (story, fact file, diary entry, poem, set of instructions, recount)
- Check that you understand what your spellings mean by writing them in sentences
- Go to Pobble 365 online and write a story based on the picture of the day

Maths

- Complete any activities sent to you over School360
- Practise your times tables 2s, 5s and 10s (Year 1)
- Practical activities could include: measuring quantities when cooking or baking, going outdoors to represent numbers/ calculations with natural materials
- Go on a shape hunt around the house
- Use different shapes to see what you can build!
- Practise telling the time by planning a daily schedule using an analogue clock

History

- Conduct a research project into the history of dinosaurs
- Create a fact file about a historically significant person of interest to you
- Create a history quiz to test your family's knowledge out!

Music

- Listen to a piece of music you know well and enjoy. Clap along with the pulse and enjoy!
- Practise any instruments you play
- Compose a piece of percussion music and perform it for your family. (Lots of household items work well for percussion: upturned pots and pans, empty bottles, a jar of rice... the list is endless!)
- Compose a song about a topic of your choosing

Geography

- Conduct research on a country that interests you
- Learn the countries and capital cities of the UK and draw on a map
- Research which areas of the world dinosaur fossils have been found in
- Draw a map of key landmarks in your local area

PE

- Play your favourite sport with a family member
- Try to beat your personal best this could be for anything physical such as number of skips in a row, how far or high you can jump, how many 'keepy-uppies' you can do... anything really!
- Go for a long walk on the beach with an adult

RE

- Make a Christian Easter garden or a Buddhist Zen garden out of natural materials
- Research a festival from any religion and create a fact file

Science

- Complete any activities sent to you over School360
- Conducting simple observations and investigations in your home, with supervision (see information on Science Week letter)

• Research different mammals, birds and reptiles and make a fact file about your favourite animal

Art

- In pencil, sketch a variety of local coastal animals
