#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the second half of this spring term!

A few much-needed improvements were done in and around school over the half term break. You may have noticed the new porch at the school entrance, which not only looks much better but also greatly improves security. The log cabin also has a new improved door and we have new fencing running along the path up to the top gate and around the perimeter of the school, helping to keep everyone safe. Sadly, HMS Hipsburn was beyond repair and we have removed it for safety reasons.

Thanks again to everyone who took the time to complete our recent Parent Survey. We had 48 replies and were really pleased to see many positive responses - 96% saying their child is happy at school; 100% saying their child feels safe at school and 98% saying they would recommend the school to another parent. This should make us all proud of our school and the staff and pupils who make it a great environment to learn in.

We are not completely resting on our laurels as we take on board the 18% who feel SEND support could be better and we will look at how this can be improved upon. 8% of parents did not feel the school makes them aware of what their child will be learning during the year, which did surprise us somewhat as we put so much work in to our website offering and each class has their own page highlighting their topics for a given term. Please take a look at the website as there is so much information on there and we work hard to keep it up to date and relevant to what is going on.

The news at the moment is very much dominated by the **Covid19 virus** which is spreading further around the globe. We continue to follow advice and guidance from Public Health England and the Department for Education. # We love beach schools





The fair will be in Bamburgh classroom and parents can access the fair directly from the KS1 yard (the room is the one facing the log cabin).


#### Science Week - Our Diverse Planet


### Talking PANTS with your children


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Just wanted to say I'm really supportive of the change of focus on world book day away from the dressing up and more towards the enjoyment of books in an eco-friendly way.
