Etal Class Overview – Summer 1 2019

Topic: How was life different for children in Victorian Britain?

Subject	What we will learn this half term
English	Children will be using the music video <i>Titanium</i> to write a narrative of the events that have occurred, using dialogue to move the action on and convey atmosphere.
	Our class book this half term will be <i>Street Child</i> by Berlie Doherty: a fictional account of the experiences of Jim Jarvis, a young orphan who escapes the workhouse in 1860's London and survives brutal treatment and desperate circumstances until he is taken in by Dr. Barnardo, founder of a school for the city's "ragged" children.
	We will use this book as a stimulus to write our own newspaper reports focused on life in Victorian Britain.

	 stories from world religions, less known or extinct religions as well as different cultures. We will focus on: Judaism and Christianity- the Judeo-Christian story of creation Compare Creation stories of the Abrahamic religions Hinduism Sikhism Different types of creation stories Compare creation stories of world religions
PSHE	 Changing Me My self-image Puberty Babies- conception to birth Attraction
PE	Tennis with Mrs BurroughsTeam games
Computing	Computing this half term will focus on Kodu Programming- creating games using a 3D scene editor.
Music	You've got a friend This unit will focus on 'You've got a friend' by Carole King- a song about friendship. This will come together as an ensemble using band and orchestral instruments.
French	Family and Friends Children will apply and develop their skills and knowledge of areas such as animals, home and family to extend their conversational abilities. They will consolidate understanding of descriptive language and learn how adjectives must 'agree' with the noun.
