

Dream to Change the World (Whole School Project)

Bamburgh Class Topic Overview – Summer 1

English:

This half term the children will have daily phonics, guided reading, spellings and handwriting sessions. Using a range of texts children will develop skills in phonic recognition, decoding words, understanding how to use expression and inference skills. Each text will be used to teach children skills in handwriting, punctuation and sentence control whilst developing their ability to write on an extended theme. Our core text is 'Dream to Change the World – The story of John La Rose' by Ken Wilson-Max.

Writing Skills (SPAG & Composition)

Narrative

- Write narratives about personal experiences and those of others (real and fictional).
- Understand how the grammatical patterns in a sentence indicate its function as a statement, question, exclamation or command.

Advert

- Use present tense accurately and consistently for persuasive adverts.
- · Identify purpose for writing.

John La Rose

- To learn about the life of John La Rose
- To consider the importance of his work as a cultural and political activist.
- To explore how he has been recognised for his achievements.


Floella Benjamin

- To explore how she has been recognised for her achievements.

Science

Plants (cont. from last half term)

- Understand what a plant needs in order to grow well.
- Identify and describe a variety of common flowering plants and
- Understand the difference between evergreen and deciduous plants.
- Know about different sources of food grown by farmers.
- Know how plants change over time.

Animals including Humans

- Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.
- Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

Key Questions: Which of our senses is the most accurate at identifying food? How and why do we grow and change? Why are we all different heights?

Comparative test: Is our sense of smell better when we can't see? Do bananas make us run faster?

Identify & Classify: What are the names for all the parts of our bodies.

Music Charanga Music School - English Model Music Curriculum Unit 3 - How Does Music Make the World a Better Place?

This Unit of Work celebrates a wide range of musical styles. The clearly sequenced lessons support the key areas of the English Model Music Curriculum; Listening, Singing, Playing Composing and Performing. Children will:

- Find and try to keep a steady beat.
- Very simple rhythm patterns using long and short.
- Very simple melodic patterns using high and low.

Geography

Food and Farming (continued from last half term)

We will continue to explore farms in the UK and look at how these help to produce many of the foods we eat.

Where is Trinidad?

As part of our whole school project we will explore, find and locate where Trinidad is using maps and globes. Children will: Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom, and of a small area in a contrasting non-European country.

- Become increasingly competent and confident and access a broad range of opportunities to extend their agility, balance and coordination, individually and with others.
- They will engage in competitive (both against self and against others) and co-operative physical activities, in a range of increasingly challenging situations.

- Construct and interpret a tally chart.
