Computing	Computing Systems and networks - sharing information creating media.
Music	We will be focusing our music this half term around the song Happy by Pharrell Williams, building on knowledge about the different aspects of music through learning to sing the song, play instruments with it and compose music, leading to creating a final performance.
French	We will learn about school life in French this half term and focus on key vocabulary related to objects, subjects and prepositional language.
