

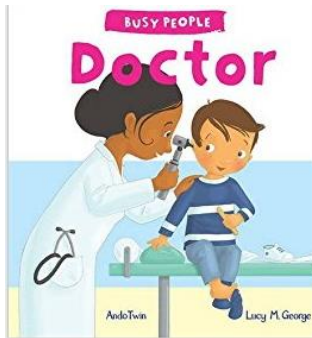

Warkworth Castle Class - Preschool

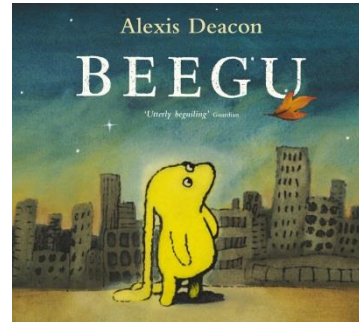
'Busy People' by Lucy M. George and Ando Twin

Beegu by Alexis Deacon

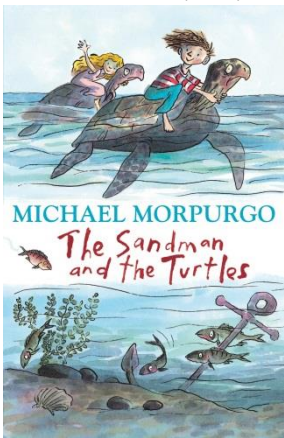

Lindisfarne Castle Class - Year 2

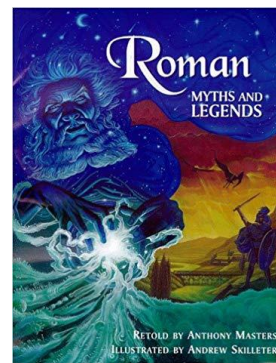
The Sandman and the Turtles by Michael Morpurgo
