	World Wide Web, through learning how search engines work (including how they select and rank results) and what influences searching, and through comparing different search engines. They will then investigate different methods of communication, before focusing on internet-based communication. Finally, they will evaluate which methods of internet communication to use for particular purposes.
Music	
French	This half term, children will learn and revise how to use the simple future tense in the context of talking about growing up and will use appropriate pronunciation. They will use a French dictionary to develop sentences and follow a simple story.
