Children will learn about all sorts of growth, including buildings, eco-friendly behaviours, animals and even how we can grow plants on Mars! Across the school, we will also take part in other STEM activities to celebrate science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

Growth

After the success of last year's live online sessions with the National Farming Union, every class will once again take part in sessions to explore the Great British countryside and meet the people who look after its landscapes, animals, and farms.

In Early Years and Key Stage 1, children will learn all about minibeasts, where they live, and their special role in British farming.

In Key Stage 2, children will learn about the life cycles of animals, by meeting some real-life Belted Galloway calves (and maybe even seeing some lambs being born)! They will also learn about the relationship between farming and climate change.
