Dear Parents,

We will be holding a whole school Science Week from Monday 16<sup>th</sup> - Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March. The theme for this year is *Our Diverse Planet*. The week will be filled with a range of STEM activities to promote the importance of science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

## **Our Diverse Planet**

Each class will be focusing on a different continent and basing their science lessons around this, with opportunities for investigations that will enable children to explore current world issues such as renewable energy sources; flooding; and animal adaptation to an increasing human population. As an eco-school, it is important to us that children are not only made aware of these environmental issues, but that they can also begin to explore how we can all be involved in addressing them.

#### **STEM visitors**

To provide enrichment of STEM subjects, and to demonstrate their value in life and future careers, we have volunteers who will be coming in to deliver presentations and workshops with the whole school. We will learn about career opportunities within STEM, and take part in an outdoor workshop to explore the biodiversity of our school grounds.

- Content Clear, accurate and informative about STEM topic
- Effective communication presented and communicated in an engaging way
