Reality check: books as a portal into life today

Featuring £1 book authors Ben Bailey Smith, Sharna Jackson, and Rashmi Sirdeshpande, students will learn about creating realist fiction or writing non-fiction on topical issues. Using your imagination: books as a way to imagine the impossible

Featuring £1 book authors Nathan Bryon and Dapo Adeola, Simon Farnaby, Michael Morpurgo, Joanna Nadin and Rikin Parekh, and Nadia Shireen, students will explore creating fantastical and improbable worlds for their stories.

Across the school, every class will be focusing on Sandra Dieckmann's picture book- Leaf. We will be using the book and its themes- relating to global



warming, displacement, exclusion, family and journeys- as a stimulus for discussion, writing, science and creative work.

Book exchange

At Hipsburn Primary we love talking about all things books and one of our favourite things to do is sharing a recommendation of a good book with our friends, so we are inviting all children to participate in a big book exchange!

To take part, children should bring in a book that they have read and they will then be able to exchange it for another pre-loved book. On World Book Day, children will write a review to go with their book before the exchange commences.

To celebrate our favourite book characters, we are holding a 'Design your own potato book character' whole school competition on World Book Day. Get creative and turn a potato into one of your favourite characters- you can use a range of materials in your design such as googly eyes, paint etc.
