Evaluation and Impact of Hipsburn Primary Sports Funding 2017-2018

Under the Primary PE & Sport funding initiative, in 2017/18 we initially received £8510 and in September 2017 this was increased to £13,418 to improve PE and sport in our school. The impact of the funding was considered with the following terms in mind:

- delivery of high quality PE lessons
- participation and success in competitive school sport
- a broader range of activities on offer
- personal health and well-being of pupils
- promoting pupil activity through involvement in organised games at breaks and lunchtime.
- improved attitudes and behaviour towards learning

The money was spent in the following ways and the impact was:

PE Curriculum Teaching JB	KS1 & KS2 Pupils: Year 2 for 2x ½ Terms, Year 4 & Year 5 for 4x ½ Terms Year 5 & Year 6 for 6x ½ Terms Afterschool Clubs	£5,500	Specialist PE Teacher employed all year round to deliver weekly sessions to pupils (Year 2 – Year 6), giving the older pupils / classes the majority of time throughout the year. Afterschool club of different activities (Multi-sports, hockey, gymnastics, Street Dance, Tennis) had popular uptake for EYFS, KS1 and KS2. Each half term, every class had a mini-tournament that concluded their half term activities. Sports Awards promoting positive attitudes and skills awarded each half term. In addition KS2 took part in an interschool's festival in hockey (Autumn), Football and Basketball (Spring) and Rounders (Summer). A lunch time club was offered and the Mini Leaders supported to run lunch time activities. Next Steps: PE teacher to develop PE plans and curriculum overview to support other teaching staff in an allotted PPA time aiding to whole school improvement of PE quality, make regular interschool's festivals, support KS2 class teacher to develop Mini Leaders within school.
Swimming Transport & Life Saving Skills	KS2	£600	Transport to Willowburn Swimming pool to support those KS2 pupils who have not achieved their 25m badge whilst developing water safety and life saving skills for those that have. Significant impact to teach life skills on two levels – basic survival and survival to help others too. Next Steps: Continue to use specialist instructors to make sure all KS2 achieve the minimum and aim to have more children reach extension sessions of life saving extras.

Multi-Sports	Reception - KS2	£480	Teaching of multi-skills and rugby has been positive
& Rugby x 3 Terms	Afterschool Club		with KS1 and all KS2 classes receiving coaching. The afterschool club was an opportunity for additional year groups to have coach expertise. KS2 took part in two local rugby festivals with coach support and successful winning team. Next Steps: Continue with specialist coach for sessions and afterschool club and aim to participate in more inter-schools tournament, support gifted pupils.
Cricket	KS1 & KS2	£450	Teaching of cricket, allowed opportunity for competitive sports to be trailed. Children in KS2 took part in two local cricket festivals. Next Steps: Continue with cricket as part of PE for the future and an afterschool club.
Mudlarks - Outdoor Project	EYFS & KS1	£750	EYFS and KS1 attended specialist day sessions at the beach. Promoting outdoor learning, use, knowledge and respect of the outdoor environment. Developing staff CPD whilst supporting the sessions. Next Steps: Look at opportunities for additional classes to attend and for staff to attend CPD training so can run self-sufficiently.
Inter-schools Competitions and Transport	KS1 and KS2	£245	Many of the interschool competitions academic year 2017-2018 did not go ahead or could not be attended. However, children were given the opportunity to take part in inter-schools competitions including Cricket, Hockey, Rugby, Football, and Rounders, as well as girls only Football. More regular afterschool football fixtures were attended. Next Steps: Work alongside local schools to develop more opportunities like these and continue to have more afterschool friendly festivals to help transport costs and ways to make more frequent and sustainable.
Equipment	All Pupils: EYFS – Year 6	£382.50	Resources – Sports day sacks £50 and hockey sticks £332.50 purchased in order to increase for the growing school number and allow all children to have the correct, suitable and safe equipment to participate in sports. Playground equipment developed with boxes of resources. Next Steps: Re-evaluate what equipment is needed so can invest in a progression of items each year e.g. basket ball nets, gymnastic apparatus and additional sports.
Outdoor Play Frame	All Pupils: EYFS – Year 6	£5000	New frame developed for outdoor area, can be used for PE sessions but especially outdoor play. Encourage physical development independently – working on active life style, challenge, social skills building into the bigger picture of a healthy lifestyle, especially Upper KS2. Next Steps: Investigate more outdoor equipment to invest in so more pupils can use at any one time.
