School Council

This year Hipsburn started a new group - led by Miss Cowell - called the School Council. At the start of the year children who wanted to be part of it, sent in an application letter describing why they should be in the school council. The children read this in front of their year group. Everyone then voted for who they wanted to be part of the school council. We normally have at least one meeting per term, where we talk about things the children or teachers have suggested. These include new equipment for the playgrounds, different after school clubs, crew treats and more. After we write down all of our ideas, they go to Mr Moloney who reviews the ideas, and if he thinks they are appropriate the school try and put them into action. Each September, 2 new children from each year group will be selected to work with the school council and come up with their own ideas. It is an amazing opportunity for children as it lets them come up with some ideas - rather than just the teachers and adults coming up with it all!
